ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

Report of the President:

My first year as President flew by in a flash but throughout it remained an honor and privilege to be in the service of this organization with its rich 112-year old heritage which has stood firm against the test of time.

Whilst surrounded by tough economic pressures, unwelcome societal degradation and global political uncertainty, we soldiered on and remained driven by our mission namely “To be professionally driven custodians of amateur golf in South Africa whilst recording and preserving the history, traditions and integrity of the game in the country, and also creating an environment in which the game is accessible to all who wish to play it”.

A maturing GolfRSA

Since its establishment in 2015, GolfRSA now executes in full swing as it effectively mitigates the past systemic risk in the organisation by diversifying the sources of income and increasing the flow of funds from sponsors and partners. It has been successful in reducing cost as a professional company run by paid professionals to nurture and grow the interests of amateur golf, for and on behalf of its stakeholders.

2019 was a landmark in GolfRSA’s history as it officially incorporated both the South African Golf Development Board (SAGDB) and the South African Disabled Golf Association (SADGA) as bona fide members by invitation of GolfRSA. It transpired in fulfilment of the original intent to establish both organisations as the initial invitees to GolfRSA.

The SAGA and GolfRSA Business Plan

To quote past President, Geoff Taylor, “The SAGA business case to the period ending 2021 was centered on the formation of GolfRSA and its ability to unlock the latent value in amateur golf by realising operational efficiencies, commercialising the properties belonging to the SAGA and WGSA and maximising commercial opportunities to which the SAGA and WGSA can provide access.”

It is expected that in the three-year cycle of 2019, 2020 and 2021 GolfRSA must be generating suitable surpluses in order to fund all its operations and rebuild the SAGA and WGSA reserves.

The SAGA annual financial statements for 2019 show a surplus of R4.4m compared to just over R3m in 2018. Though this augurs well for the future, it was largely due to the introduction of a number of austerity measures including trimming the number of

tournaments, meetings and other frivolous expenditure.

Whilst SAGA performed well financially, as the major shareholder of GolfRSA, we should be keenly interested in the financial performance of GolfRSA in the context of its consolidated accounts.

In 2017 GolfRSA (consolidated as GolfRSA, SAGA & WGSA) produced a deficit of R3,853M and in 2018 the financial performance, though still in the red, significantly improved to a deficit of R0,590m. In 2019, GolfRSA produced a historic surplus of R0,746m which was adjusted to R2,050m after the HNA sponsorship and management fee was applied to the financials as income.

From this it is clear that GolfRSA is proving to be a successful structure to entrench the sustainability of amateur golf and the administration thereof going forward.

Government and SASCOC Relations

The government, via its ministry the Department of Sports and Culture (DSAC) and its agency SASCOC remain aware of the activities the SAGA and WGSA. Though considerably reduced from previous years, we continue to receive an annual financial grant from DSAC. SASCOC issues Protea colors for our national teams. Though very time-consuming and draining, we diligently complete all the statutory and governance reporting required by both bodies throughout the year.

We enjoy good relations with SRSA and SASCOC.

Transformation

Social Responsibility and Transformation remain a high priority for SAGA. Our transformation charter is actively implemented, and the scorecard is tracking well. Through the successful intervention of GolfRSA’s Development and Transformation Officer, all our affiliate Unions have their transformation charters in place.

Next year will see the culmination of a three-year process to meet transformation targets in Provincial representative teams. Tournaments will have representivity as a condition of participation and will be applied as per pre-agreed guidelines in September 2016.

External Communications

Lali Stander and Brendan Barratt of GolfRSA still spearhead our external communications which has improved in leaps and bounds from previous years. We

are much more visible on digital channels and attempt to optimally exploit modern-day social media platforms.

USGA Course Rating (with Slope) and Handicap Index System

The new world handicapping system (WHS) which calculates handicaps will be going live on 1 January 2020. Preparations and roll-out has been frantic but thorough and largely driven by Ms Wimpie du Plessis as our front-person. We envisage that the roll-out will be smooth.

The dust has settled on the introduction of handicap-index and course rating in 2018. By all accounts it has been favorably accepted by the golfing fraternity in South Africa.

Course rating capacity is a challenge throughout the country and we will embark on train the trainer initiatives early in the new year.

Junior Golf

Junior golf in South Africa is at its peak in terms of levels of skill, levels of performance and depth of talent. We have been continental Champions of Africa for a very long time but 2019 was a crowning year when our junior Proteas won the Toyota Junior golf World Cup tournament in Japan.

An additional feather in our cap was the selection of 5 of our juniors to represent the Rest of the World Junior Team at the Junior Presidents cup in Melbourne, Australia. Though the Americans narrowly beat the Internationals, the South African players accounted well for themselves and flew the SA flag high and proud for us.

There have been several national and international successes at junior level and details can be found in the result list at the end of this report.

GolfRSA National Squad

Mr Johann Rupert, for whom we are eternally grateful, is the benefactor of the funding of our National squad and being in its 4th year of implementation, it is clear that the quality of amateur stars arising out of the squad is at an unsurpassed level. We are confident that our team for next year's World Amateur Team Championship (Eisenhower Trophy) will not be competing for a top 10 spot but will actually be contenders for title honors.

Stakeholder Relationships

We maintain very strong relationships with stakeholders namely The Sunshine Tour, the PGA of South Africa, Club Managers Association of South Africa, and the Nomads. Closer to home the relationships between the SAGA, the Golf Unions, the golf clubs and the affiliated golfers are strong. Tournaments for handicapped players have been introduced namely the Cape Wine Series and the Champion-of-Champions and the take-up by golfers has been a huge success.

Initiatives have commenced in collaboration with potential strategic partners to look at creative solutions to help retain golfers in the national pool. More will be revealed about this in the new year.

The SA Open: 2019/2020 Edition

The 2019 edition of the SA Open was held at Rand Park Golf Club with a record 11 amateur golfers in the field. 10 of the amateurs were members of the National Squad and 1 other, who came through the SA Open qualifying tournaments.

Casey Jarvis, Christo Lamprecht and Jayden Schaper made the cut and Jayden Schaper was the eventual winner of the Freddie Tait trophy as the top finishing amateur on 13-under and in overall 6th place.

The occasion marked the sunset of the illustrious career of golf commentating supremo Denis Hutchinson. The Sunshine Tour, PGA and SAGA collaborated to initiate the Denis Hutchinson annual challenge between our top amateurs and the Pro's in recognition of Hutchie's remarkable performances and career. This will commence in 2020.

Sponsors and Benefactors

On behalf of the National Executive Committee I wish to extend my gratitude to all our sponsors and benefactors who continue to assist with the promotion, growth and development of amateur golf in this country. These include Titleist, Tempest Car Hire, Srixon, Tsogo Sun, Antonij Rupert wines and AON.

We remain grateful to the Nomads for pumping money into junior golf and recognize the personal contributions of Mr Mike McGrath of HNA and Mr Johann Rupert, GolfRSA Board Chairman, who continue to place the interests of amateur golf high on their agendas.

Constitution

The SAGA Constitution received a major overhaul in 2019 to enable the transition towards more cost-effective and streamlined fulfillment of our SAGA operations influenced in the main by the impact of the change of the financial year-end to 31 December coupled with the merger with WGSA under the umbrella of GolfRSA which requires consolidated a consolidated audit.

February has thus been deemed too early to have the AGM and it was moved towards the end of April in alignment with the AGM of WGSA and GolfRSA. Since the SAGA AGM moved from September to February a few years ago and it took place with the SA Amateur at a gathering where not all Unions had delegates in attendance, it became appropriate to review the voting strength carried by Unions through delegates who were physically in attendance versus the voting strength of a Union carried by an individual or a proxy.

The constitutional amendments addressed the following:

- Proportionate voting powers at National Executive Meetings removed,
- Removing reference to specific tournaments at which to hold National Executive Committee (NEC) meetings,
- SAGA Office Bearers to detach from their responsibilities at their Unions within 3 months after appointment,
- Empowering the NEC to mandate the Management Committee to make expedient operational decisions,
- A single Union delegate at the AGM may carry the full voting power of that Union, and
- AGM deadline extended to within 4 months after the financial year end (no longer a few weeks).

Words of Thanks

I am grateful to all who contribute to the success of SAGA. I do not want to single out anyone because as a collective we have and will continue to move mountains.

I am particularly thankful to the Office Bearers, the SAGA Manco, The National Executive Committee and the staff of GolfRSA.

It will be remiss of me not to also thank HNA, the SAGDB and the Board of Directors of GolfRSA for their valued contributions to amateur golf.

Finally, our Auditors also deserve a special mention. Thank you for the huge role that you play.

2019 marks the 11th year that I have served on the Executive of SAGA and I can unreservedly state that I am a better person for having done that, much more enriched and certainly fulfilled.

ALL AFRICA JUNIOR GOLF TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP - Phakalane GE, Gaborone, Botswana, 10 – 16 March 2019

Caitlyn Macnab and Kiera Floyd and Kaiyuree Moodley combined for a winning score of 551 in the girls' competition while Zimbabwe edged out Nigeria with a final round 171 to finish second.

Sam Simpson, Casey Jarvis, Martin Vorster and Christo Lamprecht kept South Africa's proud winning record on track with a total score of 806, while Uganda made up six shots in the final round to take second. The runner-up finish guaranteed a spot in field with South Africa in the world-class international team event at the Chukyo Golf Club in Toyota City. South Africa also enjoyed a strong showing in the Individual Competitions.

Macnab won the Girls Competition on a total score of 20-under-par 272, with rounds of 66, 71, 67 and 68. Moodley was second on 284 and Floyd third on 290. New GolfRSA National Squad cap Simpson won the Boys Competition by nine strokes on a winning score of 23-under-par 265 with rounds of 64, 69, 63 and 69. Runner-up Lamprecht finished on 274, Jarvis was third on 275 and Vorster's final round 68 saw him finish fourth on 276.

WORLD JUNIOR GOLF TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS - Chukyo Country Club, Japan, 18 – 21 June

Eighteen years after Major winner Louis Oosthuizen won the Junior Golf World Cup with past Masters champion Charl Schwartzel, Albert Kruger and Christian Ries, two protégées from his Junior Golf Academy – Martin Vorster and Christo Lamprecht – did the Open champion proud with a record-breaking victory for South Africa alongside fellow GolfRSA National Squad team-mates Sam Simpson and Casey Jarvis.

The GolfRSA Junior Proteas posted three-under 210 in the final round to triumph on a staggering 41-under-par, 811 total, becoming the first team in the 27-year history of the illustrious event to break the 40-under barrier.

South Africa wound up a full 11 shots clear of runner-up Japan and 12 ahead of Spain.

Vorster from Mossel Bay and Western Province's Simpson led the challenge on the last day with a pair of 68s. They were backed up by Ekurhuleni's Jarvis, who carded 74 while Lamprecht returned a non-counting 75.
